Bella Finally Learns to Love and Trust

Our beloved best friend and joyful rescue dog, Lydia, died September 1, 2021. Before Lydia, we had said our painful goodbyes to three other rescues, magnificent Newfoundlands. We were crushed by all of this loss and definitely not ready to love another dog.

But a phone call came out of the blue, bringing us a new beginning that mended and healed our inconsolable broken hearts. Her name is Bella, sweet Bella...

Barb from For Pooch Sakes Grooming was grooming Bella for the Humane Society shelter. She called and told us that Bella had been surrendered to the shelter three days after Christmas 2021. She only spent a few days at the shelter before going into foster care, but she was being returned. We had a lengthy conversation with Bella's foster parents and ultimately, we decided to adopt her.

The first week we had Bella, she appeared to have some PTSD and trauma symptoms. We recognized that her behaviors may not have been exhibited at the shelter. As time went on, we started to research dog PTSD and behaviors like Bella's so we could provide her with everything she needed to feel safe.

For Bella, indoors was a scary place. She did not know her name. Physical contact seemed to be foreign and scary. She saw us as strangers and kept her distance. If we were in the kitchen, she would move to the living room or to the laundry room. She preferred lying under the kitchen table or in other safe hiding spots rather than on the several cushy dog beds we had dispersed throughout our home. Despite her fears, Bella was incredibly sweet.

We were bonding emotionally to Bella. She avoided living room furniture, didn't touch or sniff anything, wasn't curious, and didn't explore. She was fearful of toys and didn't know what to do with them. She was afraid to take a treat from our hand. She would crouch and reluctantly approach a treat, like a feral, when it was tossed to her. We needed to gently coax and encourage her to her bowl for meals. She ate ever so slowly all the while keeping an eye on us and her surroundings. If we coughed or sneezed she would cower. In spite of her fears, she was easy to live with. Always sweet, but painfully submissive.

Bella feared almost everything in our forested neighborhood... tall grass, foreign smells, unknown sounds, trash bins. She was even scared of the dark! Daily walks were a stretch for her. We honored that and let her go at her own pace. We were learning her language; what she needed to feel safe and how to trust. But we also recognized we needed professional help in order for Bella to live a happy life and thrive.





We had Alyssa Forrest with Forrest Tails Dog Training help Bella build self confidence, self assurance, gain trust and feel safe. Over the next few months, Bella's health checks confirmed her diagnosis of lupus

and also diagnosed her with pannus eye disease, both of which need constant attention and care.



Bella is now a more confident dog who simply needs us to follow her rhythm and pace in order to feel safe. We have found that slow, patient, gentle, and quiet is her language, and we are more than happy to honor that. It is most important for us to pay attention and learn her language so that she can feel supported and uplifted.

Bella has come so far with her demeanor and daily life. She now initiates play. She exuberantly plays with squeaker toys and balls. She plays catch and seeks out snuggles and affection. Now she sits at the kitchen drawer patiently waiting for her treat after dinner. She never lets us forget that she deserves her treat!

Thirteen months after adopting Bella, she went upstairs for the first time by herself to realize it's not a scary place. She finally discovered the cushy dog bed that's been waiting for her. She hauls her toys upstairs and down. And most importantly, Bella knows what love feels like and that she can count on it and fully trust.

Meet Our Leadership Team

Robson Reyes, our Executive Director, came to us from the Los Angeles area with an extensive background in marketing for non-profit organizations. His love of the mountains brought him to Pagosa Springs, and with this non-profit knowledge he transitioned seamlessly into the Director position when it became available. This marketing and fundraising expertise has helped grow the organization, and we are extremely grateful to have him on board. He and his wife also run a parrot rescue from their home and currently have over 30 birds, as well as two well behaved cats, and an adorable daughter.

Liz Andreas has been with HSPS since 2011 and is currently the Community Programs Director. Before this, Liz successfully managed our animal shelter for eight years, taking incredible care of the animals during her tenure as Shelter Manager. In her new role as Community Programs Director, she has been instrumental in educating and assisting the community with several of our programs, such as our feral cat TNR program. Liz also works with the Department of Human Services and Sheriff's Department to help those in need of food, spay and neuter assistance, and emergency medical care. Liz is also currently fostering kittens that are too small to be placed up for adoption.

Our Shelter Manager, **Cindy Cunningham**, started her career with the Wild Animal Park in San Diego, and worked with every animal from possums to mountain lions. She branched out into veterinary medicine for 22 years as a veterinary technician and as a manager for various clinics, boarding facilities, and an equestrian center. In the Virgin Islands she worked with everything from iguanas to pelicans! We can't think of an animal that has not passed through her kind hands and received loving care. She has adopted several special needs pets that go everywhere with her. Positive reinforcement training has always been a cornerstone of her ideology, and sharing this knowledge with our shelter staff has benefitted our animals greatly.

Cindy Chomley has been with us for seven years. After owning a drafting and design company for 15 years, Cindy is currently the Manager of the Thrift Store and under her guidance it continues to flourish. The store is our main revenue source other than our fundraisers and donations, so her position is extremely important to the success of our organization as a whole. Cindy loved traveling to National Parks out west and wanted to relocate to the mountains. After a visit to the area, Cindy and her family moved here from Florida years ago. Always having been a "thriftier" family, her kids call this "mom's dream job". She currently has four lovely cats.
